BACKGROUND

Honi School was started in the year 1988 after settlement of the landless persons in Mweiga General Farm (Mweiga Block I). A piece of land was set aside during settlement and it is on this land that the school sits. It started as a nursery school. In 1989, enrolment for standard one took place. The parents continued to build wooden classrooms, one per year until 1996 when the school presented the first batch of candidates for K.C.P.E. Examination. They excelled setting the pace for the future learners to put more effort in their studies.

The local community i.e. Parents and Guardians in collaboration with donors, well-wishers and other development partners have come together over the years to try and put up basic infrastructure in the school so as to accord the learners a conducive learning environment. They have managed to put up some new infrastructure thereby according the learners a more improved learning environment. They have also been extensively engaged in tree planting thereby ensuring that environmental conservation is well observed.

The school's population has continued to grow over the years with the current enrolment being 280 learners in the primary and junior school and 40 learners in the ECDE, a total of 320 learners.

However, despite the efforts outlined above, the school still faces a number of challenges which if addressed would make this school a premier and prestigious institution of learning.

These challenges are as highlighted hereunder:

- i. The school's Library is not fully stocked.
- ii. The school does not have a science laboratory.
- iii. Lack of adequate furniture for both learners and the teachers.
- iv. The school lacks office computers and a photocopier.
- v. Inadequate water storage tanks and water harvesting infrastructure.
- vi. The school's playground needs some levelling and filling of potholes.

Despite the challenges listed above, the academic standards of the school have continued to improve over the years, where the school has always had a good number of candidates who sit the KCPE Exam admitted to prestigious public secondary schools in the country upto the year 2023 when the last batch of KCPE candidates sat their examination. In the year 2025, the pioneer Grade under CBE sat the first ever KJSEA with most of the candidates securing places and enrolment into C1 and C2 senior schools.

I would like to make a passionate appeal to the donors and well-wishers to come to the aid of the school and assist us in addressing the aforementioned challenges. This way we will have accorded our teachers and learners a conducive working and learning environment as we look forward to having more exemplary results in future.
